

Article II of the US Constitution

Constitutional Requirement for a US Citizen (Natural born or Naturalized) to be elected to the office of the President:

“No Person except a natural born Citizen or a Citizen of the United States, at the time of the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be eligible to the Office of the President, neither shall any person be eligible to that Office who shall not have Attained to the Age of thirty five years, and been fourteen years a Resident within the United States.”

The United States was recognized as new country by the Treaty of Paris signed by Our Founding Fathers and King George III of England in **1783**. Thus, Our First President George Washington, was our First foreign-born US president, having been born in the Colony of Virginia under the English Crown and paid allegiance to England when he accepted his commission as an Army Officer
